The Program

Clara E. Hill, Ph.D., Professor of Psychology at the University of Maryland, is well-known for her theory and research on dream work. She will describe her method of working with dreams, a consensual qualitative method for analyzing therapy transcripts that stays close to the clinical material and is theory-neutral, rather than being dominated by any particular theoretical view. Her method can be used by any clinician and is supported by research. The program will include an interactive research project, and group discussion of a therapy session in which insight resulted from discussion of a dream.

At the conclusion of this presentation participants will be able to describe the following: (1) the Hill model for working with dreams; (2) the empirical research on working with dreams in therapy, and (3) how insight develops in dream work.

Clara E. Hill, Ph.D. is a Professor in the Department of Psychology at the University of Maryland. She has been the President of the Society for Psychotherapy Research, was the Editor of the Journal of Counseling Psychology, and is currently the Editor of Psychotherapy Research. Awards include the Leona Tyler Award from Division 17 of APA and the Distinguished Psychologist Award from Division 29 of APA. Her major research interests are dream work, psychotherapy process and outcome, training novice therapists in helping skills, and qualitative research. She has published 7 books and over 170 journal articles and chapters in books.

Irene Gad, M.D., Ph.D. has taught experimental psychology and human sexuality at the university level and has published numerous articles in her field. She received analytic training in Zurich, Switzerland at the C. G. Jung Institute. She is currently a certified Jungian psychoanalyst with a private practice in the Washington, D.C., area

Bonnie Gallagher, LICSW received her postgraduate training at the Baltimore Washington Institute for Psychoanalysis in analytically informed psychotherapy. Ms. Gallagher has a private practice and works part-time at Community Psychiatric Clinics. Claudia Johnson, Ph.D. earned her degree in Clinical Psychology from the University of Utah. Undertaking a personal Jungian analysis in 1985 awakened her interest in depth psychology which recognizes and utilizes archetypal forces in clinical work. She earned her Diplomate in Analytical Psychology and is currently a Jungian analyst in private practice on the Eastern Shore of Virginia.

Joseph P. Merlino, M.D., M.P.A. is the Immediate Past President of the American Academy of Psychoanalysis and Dynamic Psychiatry.
